

Lucile Turner Asher (LTA) Scholarship Guidelines

The LTA Scholarship Fund was established in December 1999. Each spring a student will be selected for a scholarship for university tuition beginning with the fall semester. The scholarship will be awarded based on the following application and scholarship guidelines.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

The LTA Scholarship will be awarded to graduating seniors meeting the following requirements:

1. The student must reside in one of the seven counties SCCF serves and must have completed three years of attendance in one of the following: the Stafford County school system, the Pratt County school system or an SCCF area school system.
2. Graduating seniors should have a high school grade point average of 2.5 or better on a 4-point scale.
3. The student should have an aptitude for mathematics, had academic success in math, and be recommended by the school faculty.
4. The student must pursue a major in mathematics or a closely related science, i.e. biology, chemistry, computer science, economics, engineering, secondary math education, statistics or physics.
5. Preference will be given to Stafford or Pratt County students and those with a verifiable financial need.
6. A Scholarship Committee will evaluate applications based on a performance-based point system.

RENEWAL / CONTINUATION GUIDELINES

1. The LTA Scholarship may be renewed for up to seven semesters of undergraduate or graduate study based on the following requirements:
 - a. Recipients must maintain a cumulative 3.0 college grade point average or better. And, a 3.0 or better term GPA for the preceding semester is required for renewal for the coming semester. Consecutive semester renewal is not required to remain eligible for subsequent semesters. The student is required to forward a copy of his/her semester grades to the SCCF office each semester.
 - b. Recipients of the LTA Scholarship must maintain a full time academic load.
 - c. If the student fails to meet GPA requirements, withdraws from college or changes to an ineligible major the LTA Scholarship will be terminated.
 - d. Subsequent year scholarship awards are dependent on a continued program in mathematics or a closely related science.
2. After graduation and when established professionally, LTA scholars are encouraged to contribute to the LTA Scholarship Fund or to other existing or new funds administered by the South Central Community Foundation.
